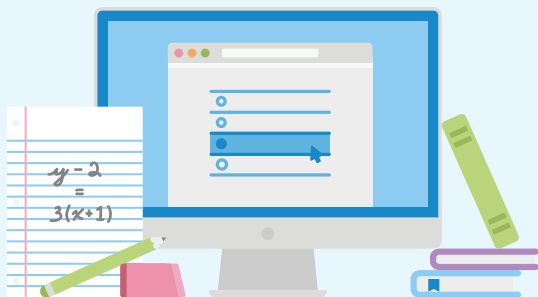
## Additional Facts

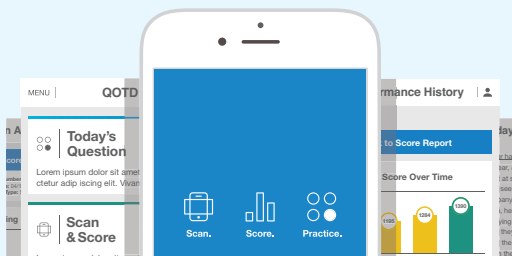
